SCOUTING THE WILDCATS: Chico State earned the California Collegiate Athletic Association's North Division title with a 15-3 league record and earned an at-large NCAA berth despite falling in 5 sets to Cal State San Bernardino in the CCAA Tournament final ... the Wildcats are led by 5-9 Jr. OH Olivia Mediano (3.65 kps, .200 att%, 2.89 dps) and 5-8 Sr. S Torey Thompson (10.94 aps, 1.24 kps, .305 att%, 3.55 dps), the CCAA Player of the Year.

SEAWOLF NCAA HISTORY: The Seawolves are making their program-record fourth straight NCAA appearance and their seventh in eight seasons ... this is UAA's ninth overall NCAA Tournament trip (1989, 1990, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016) ... UAA snapped a streak of four straight NCAA 1st Round losses with its win over Dixie State last season ... the Seawolves were a No. 2 seed in 2014 and earned the No. 1 seed for the first time last year – the program's three best seedings ever ... UAA was the No. 5 seed in 2009 when it earned its first NCAA win with a 5-set (15-12) 1st Round victory over Hawaii-Hilo in San Bernardino, Calif.

A HOWL LOTTA LOVE: UAA will lead NCAA Div. II in attendance for the second straight season, with its 1,228 per game far outdistancing Angelo State at the moment ... the Seawolves drawn eight of the top 20 single-match attendance totals, including the No. 2 (2,257 vs CWU, Nov. 10) and No. 4 (1,742 vs WWU, Oct. 22) figures.

TEAM NOTES: UAA has broken the program records for victories and winning percentage set by last year's 27-3 squad ... the 2016 Seawolves already own several outright program team records – most road wins (13), most consecutive wins (20), most consecutive sweeps (6) and most consecutive sets won (22) ... the four longest win streaks in program history have all occurred since head coach **Chris Green's** second season in 2009 ... the Seawolves lead the GNAC stats in opponent attack pct. (.119) and aces per set (1.80), and rank 2nd in kills per set (14.04) and attack pct. (.232) ... UAA ranks no lower than 35th (among 292 teams) in any category in the NCAA Div. II national stats, currently standing 8th in opponent attack pct., 12th in blocking (2.34 bps) and 17th in kills per set ... UAA is 4-1 this season and 12-4 against ranked teams since 2014 ... UAA is 22-31 against ranked opponents under Green after losing 32 straight prior to his arrival in 2008 ... UAA has gone 18-1 against non-conference opponents over the last two regular seasons, including 7-0 in neutral-court matches ... UAA has won 26 straight September matches since a 3-1 loss at then-No. 23 NW Nazarene, Sept. 25, 2014 ... UAA's loss at Chaminade ended the program's impressive streaks of seven straight road wins and 37 straight matches without being swept ... the Seawolves are 37-6 at the Alaska Airlines Center since its opening in Sept. 2014, and 83-17 at home since 2009.

THE HOOE PACKAGE: UAA has produced the GNAC Player of the Year for the second year in a row after Sr. S **Morgan Hooe** earned the honor last week in voting by the league's 11 head coaches ... a 2015 AVCA Third Team All-American and now 2-time All-GNAC selection, the former South Anchorage HS star has been among the most efficient players in the nation this year, quarterbacking a UAA team that is outthumping its opponents .230 to .117, boosted by her own GNAC-best .396 attack percentage ... Hooe earned GNAC Offensive Player of the Week honors for her play at home against Western Oregon and Concordia, and she followed with season- and career-high efforts of 52 and 56 assists in wins at Central Washington and NW Nazarene; she then topped her career high with 59 assists in the home loss to No. 19 WWU ... along with her 10.57 assists per set, Hooe is putting up 1.28 kps, 2.80 dps and 0.34 bps ... with 140 kills and 18 attack errors, she has committed multiple attack errors only three times all season, while hitting .500 or better 15 times ... the Most Outstanding Player of the SpringHill Suites Invitational racked up 47 assists in the win over No. 19 Arkansas Fort Smith and led UAA to a .258 attack pct. in those four matches, Sept. 1-3 ... Hooe also dished 47 assists in wins over two more ranked foes in Cal St. San Bernardino and Western Washington ... Hooe is the third player in program history to reach 3,500 career assists (now at 3,671), while her other UAA career ranks include 5th in assists per set (8.78), 3rd in attack pct. (.307), 2nd in victories (96) and 9th in total aces (108).

BRAUN AT THE NET: Another of UAA's four All-GNAC selections, Sr. MB **Erin Braun** is a big reason the Seawolves are in the top 15 nationally in blocks per set for the second straight year, standing 28th individually with 1.15 bps ... Braun holds GNAC ranks of 4th in attack pct. (.321) and 6th in bps, connecting for at least 5 kills on .300-plus hitting on 20 occasions this year, including a career- and GNAC season-high .706 (12-0-17) against Western Oregon ... the San Bernardino, Calif., native has posted at least four kills in 54 of her last 61 matches, along with 24 performances with 5-plus blocks in that span ... Braun earned her first career GNAC Defensive Player of the Week honor after averaging 1.43 bps and 3.00

kps in UAA's victories at WWU and SFU in September ... in the non-conference season, she led the 5-team SpringHill Suites Invitational with a .385 attack pct., and she made a tourney-best 1.31 bps at the D2 West Region Showcase ... having already set UAA's career records for block assists (404) and individual wins (98), Braun's other career ranks include 2nd in attack pct. (.312), 3rd in total blocks (443, two shy of No. 2), 6th in bps (1.08), 10th in matches played (119) and 11th in sets played (411), never missing a match in her 4-year career ... she was the GNAC Freshman of the Year in 2013, an honorable mention All-GNAC performer in 2014, and earned her third Academic All-GNAC award this season.

SWISS AIR: Capturing All-GNAC honors for the second year in a row, So. OH **Leah Swiss** has been the Seawolves' most potent offensive threat this year, smashing at least 9 kills in 27 of 31 matches and ranking 2nd in the GNAC with 3.47 kills and 4.11 points per set ... the former Dimond High star holds other GNAC ranks of 3rd in aces per set (0.41) and 15th in attack pct. (.249) ... four of Swiss's 10 double-doubles have come against nationally ranked opponents, including a then-career-high 26 kills and 15 digs against No. 15 Cal St. San Bernardino, and she ripped a career-high 27 kills against Northwest Nazarene on the way to GNAC Player of the Week honors in mid-November ... she began the year with all-tournament performances at both the SpringHill Suites Invitational and D2 West Region Showcase ... at the 5-team SpringHill, Swiss was the only player to rank in the top 5 in attack pct. (.322) and kps (3.79), while finishing 10th in dps (2.71) and serving a tourney-best 11 aces ... her offense was even sharper at the Showcase, ranking 2nd in kps (4.19) and 4th in attack pct. ... on UAA's career lists, Swiss already holds ranks of 19th in kills (665), 8th in kills per set (3.00), 16th in attack pct. (.235) and 3rd in aces per set (0.38).

AMPERING IT UP: So. L **Kyla Militante-Amper** was named honorable mention All-GNAC recently, having turned in a historic performance in the program records books this year ... the Seawolves' new single-season leader with 637 digs and counting, she is also on pace to set the average mark with 5.84 dps ... Militante-Amper set the single-match record with 43 digs against Western Washington on Oct. 22, and she is officially on pace to own every major digs record at UAA ... currently 2nd in the GNAC stats and 12th nationally with 5.84 dps, the Hillsboro, Ore. FA'ABULOUS FRESHMEN: Fr. RS **Diana Fa'amausili** and Fr. MB **Vanessa Hayes** wasted no time in contributing to the regular rotation despite their rookie status, combining for 4.05 kills and 1.97 blocks per set ... the GNAC Freshman of the Year and the only freshman on the All-GNAC first team, Fa'amausili is UAA's 2nd-leading blocker with 1.06 bps, ranking 8th in the GNAC, 55th nationally overall and 5th nationally among freshmen (t-1st among right sides) ...

Fa'amausili has delivered at least 5 kills in all 31 matches, averaging 2.82 kps on .258 hitting, and picking up her first career **GNAC Defensive Player of the Week** for her play at home against NNU and CWU ... meanwhile, Hayes has been a consistent presence, notching multiple kills and multiple blocks in 22 of 31 matches ... the Salem, Ore. (McNary HS) native hit .364 with 6 kills and 5 block assists in the win over No. 15 Cal St. San Bernardino, and she delivered her two of her best attack percentages in UAA's road victories at Simon Fraser and No. 20 Western Washington, combining for 13 kills on .462 hitting in those seven sets ... II ranks ... now a **4-time GNAC Coach of the Year** (2009, 2013, 2015, 2016) and **2-time AVCA D-II West Region Coach of the Year** (2009, 2015), Green has led UAA to NCAA Tournament berths in seven of the last eight seasons, capturing the program's highest-ever seeds the last three years ... in the 28 years before Green's arrival, the Seawolves made two NCAAAs ... UAA has won at an .824 clip (98-21) since the start of the 2013 campaign, including .882 (67-9) in league play ... after helping the Seawolves to a 10-win turnaround in his first season, Green earned both GNAC and NCAA Div. II West Region coach-of-the-year honors in 2009 when he piloted UAA to its first GNAC title and the program's first-ever NCAA victory ... Green's UAA teams have produced six All-Americans, five GNAC Players of the Year, five GNAC Newcomers of the Year and three GNAC Freshmen of the Year ... hired in Feb. 2008 as the sixth coach in UAA Volleyball history, Green spent the previous nine seasons (1999-07) as the head coach at Western Nebraska Community College, where he built a powerhouse program. Among his list of accomplishments at WNCC were a 453-55 record, the 2007 NJCAA Div. I national championship, 2006 NJCAA runner-up, and four straight 'Final 4' berths ... the Cougars finished in the top 10 at the national tournament in all of Green's seasons, producing a total of 10 first-team and six second-team All-America certificates ... in 2011, he was inducted into the NJCAA Hall of Fame ... Green is assisted by 2nd-year assistant coach **Sheldon Carvalho**, 2nd-year graduate assistant coach **Calli Scott**, and volunteer assistants **Gaynor Johansen** (7th season), **Siobhan Johansen** (3rd season), **Virgil Hooe** (1st season) and **Nathan Svedin** (1st season).
